Counseling Corner

Welcome Back Counseling <u>Presentations</u>

During the week of August 28th, all counselors gave a welcome-back presentation to each class of students. During the presentations, we shared important information that pertains to students at each grade level. We encourage all parents to start a conversation with your students about their takeaways from the presentations.



If you experience suicidal crisis or mental health-related distress after school hours, dial or text 988. 988 is the three-digit, nationwide phone number to connect directly to the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifetime. This lifeline provides 24/7, confidential support to people in suicidal crisis or mental health-related distress. There is hope, and we want our students to receive the help they need even when they are not in the school building.

Do you need help with studying?

Here are 10 study tips to help you start off the school year right!

- Ask for help. Ask a teacher to add you to their class during Wildcat Period or attend Wildcat Academy after school to get help from a teacher.
- Find useful study tools. Talk with your teacher or counselors for specific study tools that can help you study.
- Block off time to study outside of class. Create a consistent schedule that allows for efficient studying.
- Maintain your health while studying. School can be stressful! Contact your counselor if you are struggling with high levels of stress.
- Seek out your classmates. Form a study group or request a peer tutor to help you during Wildcat Period. Peer tutors are available by contacting your school counselor.
- Avoid multitasking. Students who perform other tasks while studying are less likely to recall information, so turn off the TV, silence notifications on your phone, and focus on the task at hand!
- Get enough sleep. Inadequate sleep can negatively affect academic performance. Students should try to get 7 to 8 hours of sleep per night, limit naps after school, avoid caffeine in the afternoon and evening, and take time to wind down before going to bed.
- Find your comfort zone. Find the studying environment that works best for you, ideally one that is distraction-free.
- Don't procrastinate. Plan ahead and use an agenda or the calendar on your phone to help you organize your work.
- Work on your soft skills. A strong grasp of soft skills will help you get through high school. Challenge yourself and find ways to work with others to build fundamentals such as leadership, teamwork, and communication skills.


Suden Makeup Nork

In an effort to improve our teacher-student-parent communication regarding makeup work and grades, we have implemented the below steps when a student is absent.

- Teachers should utilize a 0 or MI designation in Skyward for all missing assignments. This provides a clear understanding of a student's academic standing.
- After an absence, students will have one week to make up work (upon return to the building). Students should make arrangements to work with their teacher during Wildcat Period or Wildcat Academy.
- If a student reaches a chronic absenteeism level that a SAIP is generated, the SAIP team will communicate with teachers if the absenteeism would warrant accepting late work or if the student is purposefully choosing to be absent.

While this past year provided us with so much positivity, we also noticed growing problems with cell phone and earbud use during instructional class time. Many of you may have experienced teachers trying to navigate the struggles this has caused for learning and instruction. As a result of these struggles, we've recognized that we must take a step back from technology in an effort to move forward. To provide consistency across the building, we have developed the below guidelines. While this will be easy to follow for some students, it will be very difficult for other students. We ask that you preview this with your child(ren) prior to the beginning of the 23-24 school year.

Classroom Rules

- Cell phones and earbuds will not be permitted during any direct instruction time.
- Cell phones and earbuds may be permitted during self-directed work. However, if students are found to be abusing the use of cell phones and earbuds during this time, it will be considered a violation, and disciplinary steps will be followed.
- Cell phones and earbuds may be used in the hallways, during study halls, and at lunch, provided school rules are followed.

Consequences:

- 1) Violation 1: Teacher Warning
- 2) Violation 2: Teacher Warning and Contact Home
- 3) Violation 3: Teacher assigns detention
- 4) Violation 4 and up: Office Referral



Picture day is on Thursday, Sept 7th for all students. It is recommended that every student gets a picture taken as these are put in the yearbook and this is how they get a student ID. Purchase is NOT required.



Additional 2023 Senior Receives PA Seal of Biliteracy

The PA Seal of Biliteracy (PASB) recognizes students who are bilingual in English and a second language upon high school graduation; however, seniors who take AP exams don't receive their results until after graduation. Therefore, thirteen 2023 graduates were recognized in mid-July for qualifying for the PA Seal of Biliteracy by obtaining a "4" or "5" on the AP Spanish Language and Culture Exam. This number increased by one at the end of July since Agam Gill received his AP scores later than his classmates. Thus, the total number of recipients for the PA Seal of Biliteracy has increased to twenty-seven 2022-2023 Dallastown graduates.

Leaving School Early

When your child needs to leave school early, it is best to put the early dismissal into Skyward using your parent login. If you cannot log in to your Skyward account, you can call the high school and speak to the attendance secretary.

Having this information entered into Skyward or ahead of time by a phone call, your child will receive a "green slip," which they show to their teacher when they are to leave. At this point, they would exit the school out the front door and meet you in the front circle. If the dismissal is 2 PM or later, the student would have to exit the school by the gym out back, and you would have to pick them up back there.

Skyward is aware of this and if you do it on a desktop it should work. They are working on a fix for the App but are not sure when it will be corrected.




